



Even more importantly, that is how the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) refers to it, it less direct language: Thus an act or omission which, of itself or by intention causes death in order to eliminate suffering constitutes a murder gravely contrary to the dignity of the human person and to the respect due to the living God, his Creator.

Emmanuel's Choir Loft

The beautiful text for our entrance hymn, "See the Conqueror Mounts in Triumph," was written by Christopher

Wordsworth (1807-1885), nephew of the poet William Wordsworth. A brilliant student, he was ordained in the Anglican Church and eventually became a bishop as well as a prolific writer. You will surely recognize the familiar Beethoven "Ode to Joy" tune for these words today, a fitting musical expression of Christ's glorious triumph!

Two Historic Pipe Organs

In downtown Dayton, two historic catholic churches, Holy Trinity and St. Joseph, have long been pillars of the community.
